# HOUSE OF HOPE

## Summary of project:

In 2003, there were about 78,000 HIV/AIDS related deaths in Uganda. This number has continued to rise, leaving more and more children orphaned. House of Hope was started to help these orphaned children in south western Uganda receive adequate nutrition, clean water, medical care, education, and the security of a loving community. House of Hope has enrolled 150 children ranging in age from 3-12 years into grades 1 through 3 and there are plans to add an additional grade each year. The majority of the students live with extended families or neighbors, however, 17 of the students are living in child-run households, meaning the oldest caregiver is 14-years old or younger.

## Fund for the project:

100% of funds will help House of Hope provide salaries for teachers and give medical care to the students and staff.
